Global Culture II (1 credit, 30 hours)

Politics and Economy of Korea

Prof. Heejin Han (Division of Global & Interdisciplinary Studies)

This 9-hour course aims to help students obtain a basic understanding of Korean politics and economy, focusing on the post-democratization period. This class covers the following topics:

- Brief history of Korea, focusing on the post-World War II era
- Economic growth of Korea: "The Miracle of the Han River" and the developmental state
- Democratization and Democratic Consolidation of Korea
- South Korea and the International Politics of Northeast Asia
- Divided Korean Peninsula and its Future

Korean Culture with a Foreign Perspective

Prof. Utai Uprasen (Division of International & Area Studies)

Korean cultures will be discussed based on foreigner points of view in various issues in this 9-hour course. The significance of age and seniority in Korean society will be compared to other countries including the Western world. Korean working cultures will be explored. Language barriers, cultural shocks and the way of adaptations will also be included in the course.
