# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

# Nominations and Applications:

International candidates willing to come to the University of Enna 'Kore' for an exchange period under Erasmus+ for Studies, shall apply at their home institution. Official nominations are to be sent via email to **kiro@unikore.it** by your home University. The Kore International Relations Office (KIRO) will notify your university of your acceptance. Students must then send their completed application forms by email to kiro@unikore.it during the following time windows (More information <u>here</u>):

# FIRST SEMESTER OR FULL YEAR MOBILITY:

• Application form must be sent from 15th April to 15th June

#### SECOND SEMESTER MOBILITY:

• Application form must be sent from 16th September to 30th November

# Language requirements:

Please note that all classes (except some classes from the foreign language department) are held in Italian. Therefore, a minimum **B1** Italian level for students attending course units is highly recommended. Professors may, at their own discretion, offer reading materials in English, but **classes are taught in Italian**. Note also that **all exams are held in Italian**, and most exams are oral. Students may contact professors to inquire about their availability to run the exam in a foreign language.

# Exams:

Exams in Italy are held in multiple sessions (winter session and summer session – the autumn session is generally not available to Erasmus students). The winter session (from January till mid-February) is only available for courses taught in the first semester (the winter session is NOT available for courses that last 2 semesters ("annuali"), unless there is a midterm exam). The summer session (June and July) is available for courses taught in the I, II or both semesters. Note that each session offers two exam dates ("appelli") for each subject, so you may plan the order of exams in whichever way is more convenient to you. Important: if you didn't pass an exam during the first *appello*, you could take the exam again on the following date, even if it is in the same session.

Subject programs ("Programmi" or "schede di trasparenza") are published online on the course web-site. These programs detail the class syllabus, the required texts and all information regarding exams. It is your responsibility to read these programs carefully. Most courses also use the online teaching platform *unikorefad* to upload slides, homework assignments, test simulations.

As specified above, **all exams are held in Italian**, and many exams are exclusively oral. Students may contact professors to inquire about their availability to run the exam in a foreign language, or to replace the oral exam with a written exam but any change to the official subject program published online is entirely up to the professor.

# Italian intensive language and culture courses:

Every year the University Language Center (CLIK) offers intensive courses on Italian language and culture for international students. The course usually starts a couple of weeks before the beginning of each semester. If you intend to attend the course, please list it in your Learning Agreement (this course is worth 5 CFU). For more information consult the page of the Language Center. After passing the final exam the Language Center will issue a language certification with the results obtained.

# ECTS - Transcript of records:

The European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) is a system for transferring university credits throughout Europe. It is based on the clearness and transparency of the students' plans of study and on the assignment of appropriate credits for work completed. The objective of this system is to guarantee that credit for the courses and exams taken during the period spent is granted according to clear rules, known to students before leaving and based on precise and recognized agreements ruled by mechanisms that are common to all institutions participating in the Programme. Kore University of Enna – according to European directives regulating the ECTS- has established that 1 CFU = 1 ECTS. (More information here)

The Welcome Days are addressed to all incoming students taking part in a mobility programme (Erasmus+ for Studies, Double & Joint Degrees). During these meetings, students are offered a brief introduction to the services at the University of Enna 'Kore' by the Coordinator of KIRO and the rest of the staff, they have a chance to meet their buddy friends, the Erasmus coordinators and take a small tour of the University. At the end there will be a small refreshment party.

The Welcome Days take place at the beginning of each semester. The specific date will be announced to prospective students by email. If you miss the Welcome day, you must come to the KIRO office to register your arrival.
