Credit System	CFU - Crediti Formativi Universitari (Local Credits)
	1 CFU = 1 ECTS
	Each credit corresponds to around 25 hours of overall work by the student, including individual study, lectures (6-8 hours per credit), practical training, seminar, etc..
	The CFU are associated with the exam beyond the actual grade obtained by students. E.g, if your grade is 30/30 in an exam whose "weight" is 6 CFU, you will be awarded 6 CFU. The same if your grade is 18/30 because this does not change the weight of the exam.

	Winter Semester: (mid-September / mid-February)
	Spring Semester: (mid-February / end-July).
	The exams of the first semester take place in January and February, the exams of the second semester take place in June and July.

The Italian Grading System ranges from 18/30 to 30/30.

The highest mark is 30/30 with distinction (lode).

Exams under 18/30 are considered as “fail/not passed” and cannot be registered on the final transcript of records.

Please note that some courses ("laboratory/workshop") have only “Idoneo/Non Idoneo” or “Pass/Fail”. This is because some courses, in force of national 17.07.2023 regulations, do not foresee a grade award but only an attendance condition (frequentato/attended) or a simple “pass” (Idoneo/adequate) grade. No grade assigned but the students earn the credits.

The correspondence between ETCS evaluations and Italian marks is the following:

A = 30/30 and 30/30 cum laude

B = 28/30 and 29/30

C = 26/30 and 27/30

D = 20/30 - 25/30

E = 18/30 - 19/30

F = Fail < 18/30

Students can attend courses of languages at the University Linguistic Center but such courses can not be included in the LA

The first Italian course is free of charge for Erasmus/Exchange students.

The School will accept students with least a **B1 level of knowledge of the Italian language**, as it is necessary to attend courses and take exams (both in Italian) successfully.


All official certifications are accepted, including OLS .

Exception: Only for Master Level students who are candidates for NRMTRD Master’s exams is required **English proficiency of B2 level**.

<p>Process</p>	<p>Students send the application documents to: erasmus@agraria.unifi.it</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Enrollment form; - Learning agreement (LA): this document should be delivered online through EWP platform, if host University is connected with this new system, otherwise the Pdf form must be sent via email together with the other documents; - Copy (an English version) of Academic Transcript of Records (ToR); - Official language certificate or confirmation letter of Language Skills; - Copy of national identity card (for EU members) or a copy of passport (non-EU members) - <i>Copy of residence Permit</i> (only for Erasmus+ students with non-EU/EEA citizenship)

<p>Safety Training</p>	<p>Students must take a "workplace safety training course" as mandatory prerequisite to attend courses that entail access to laboratories, outdoor activities and internships.</p> <p>To access the General Basic Training Course (4 hours online) students must simply logging onto the platform with their Student Number and registering for "HS Workers' General Training - 2024".</p>	<p>Services and opportunities</p> <p>Erasmus students can have access to all the services and opportunities offered by the University. <p>Visa/ Residence Permit</p>	<p>If you are a Non-EU citizen intending to enter Italy you must submit your visa application (for STUDY reasons/University Enrolment) and the relevant documents to the Italian diplomatic representation. Within 8 working days from your arrival in order to legitimate your stay you must submit your Stay/Residence Permit request using a dedicated kit available at qualified post offices (Sportello Amico)</p> <p>If you are Non EU citizen regularly living in another EU country for study reasons you are not requested to get a visa to come study at UniFI provided that your stay is long no more than 360 days and that your EU residence permit is valid for the whole period you will spend in Florence. Once arrived, in order to legitimate your stay you must submit the declaration of presence to the Immigration Office-Questura (Central Police Station in the province) within 8 working days from your arrival.
