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Grading system	<p>Students' performance may be assessed in various ways. Information about these is provided in the Course Unit description. In most cases, there is a final, usually oral, exam.</p> <p>In all cases, in the Italian grading system, students are graded according to a scale ranging from 0 to 30, with 18 as a passing mark. A cum laude may be added to the highest grade (30 e lode), as a special distinction. The lowest passing grade is 18. The grades from 18 to 30 are all used. Actual grading curves differ in different degree programmes.
