General Information about the University (location, number of students, faculties)	The University of Trás-os-Montes and Alto Douro (UTAD) is a high-level institution for creating, transmitting, and disseminating culture, knowledge, and science. Located in Vila Real, in the North of Portugal, near the "Alto Douro Wine Region" World Heritage, famous for its landscape, wines, and gastronomy, it offers a quality of life ideal to live, study, and research. UTAD sets in an eco-campus that integrates one of Europe's most extensive Botanical Gardens. It has modern facilities, libraries, laboratories, online services, and sports facilities. The permanent teaching staff of 555 Professors, 100 researchers, 410 technical and administrative staff members, support c. 7700 full-time students, 130 students under the Erasmus + and other mobility programs, and 30 students attending isolated curricular units. UTAD integrates five Schools the Agrarian and Veterinary Sciences; the Human and Social Sciences; the Science and Technology; the Life and Environmental Sciences, and the School of Health. These schools have a wide range of studying programs like Bachelor's degrees and integrated master's degrees, Master's degrees, and Ph.D. degrees, covering the major areas of education and training: Agriculture and Veterinary; Health and Social Protection; Health; Services; Education; Arts and Humanities; Social Sciences; Science, Mathematics and Informatics; Engineering, Manufacturing, and Construction. UTAD integrates six Research Centre's as the Animal and Veterinary Research Centre, the Center for Studies in Letters, the Research Centre in Sports, Health Sciences and Human Development; the Centre for Research and Technology of Agroenvironmental and Biological Sciences; the Vila Real Chemistry Research Center, and the Centre for Transdisciplinary Development Studies.

Our Campuses	The campus, built on the site of several adjacent former farm estates, is located near the city centre and has bus connections to any part of the city. The campus with about 120 ha is also considered one of the largest botanical gardens in Europe, that brings together, in a single space, education, and research.  In Vila Real, there are great bus connections, and therefore living in another part of the city is not a problem for the students, as there is a bus company – Urbanos – which links every part of the city and the campuses. The last bus back to the city from the campus is at 20h00.  Vila Real is a safe town, with easy accessibility and high quality of life, integrated into a unique scenario – UNESCO World Heritage, The Douro Valley.

Grading system	Bachelor and Master's graduates are awarded a numerical grade ranging from 10 to 20 (on a scale of 0 – 20), and the grade's equivalent on the ECTS grading scale.  Doctorate graduates are awarded a grade in accordance with the bylaws of the University that confers the degree. In the case of UTAD, the grade is either Approved or Approved by Unanimity. Issuance of the transcript of records	A Transcript of Records can be issued within 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished. Note, however, that at UTAD it is the individual student's responsibility to apply for an official Transcript of Records with the International Relations Office, which serves as a mediator between foreign students and the university's Student Records System.
Semester periods	The first semester starts in mid-September and ends in late January. Examinations are held in January for approximately four weeks after a two-week Christmas Break in December. The second semester begins in early February and ends in late June, with a week-long break for the Easter holidays. Examinations begin in June and last around four weeks. There are also examination periods (mid to late July) for those who did not pass their exams. The teachers will inform students of the times and forms (written or oral) of the examinations at the beginning of the courses.
